Progression in the Program

Progress in the Nursing Program is contingent upon achievement of a grade of "C" or better in each general education and nursing course and maintenance of a 2.0 CGPA (on a 4.0 scale).

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The fee schedule is published in the KCTCS catalog or in the class schedule each semester. In addition to tuition and fees, nursing students are responsible for transportation to the various health agencies, liability insurance, books, and uniforms. Financial assistance through scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study program is available, if a student is eligible. KENTUCKY COMMUNITY & TECHNICAL COLLEGE SYSTEM

The Practical Nursing program prepares individuals to practice within the legal scope of practical nursing under the supervision of a registered nurse or physician. Use of the nursing process at the practical nursing level is toward the maintenance of health and prevention of illness, the observation and nursing care of persons experiencing changes in their health and the evaluation of patient health practices.

Classroom instruction in theory and basic nursing skills is provided on campus. Under the guidance of program faculty, students gain valuable experience in the care of clients of all ages in a variety of health care settings.

Graduates are awarded a Diploma upon completion of the curriculum and are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses. (The Kentucky Board of Nursing investigates all prior legal convictions to determine if graduates will be allowed to take NCLEX-PN.)

Graduates from the PN program may qualify to articulate into the Associate Degree Nursing program by receiving credit for the first nine hour nursing course. Additional articulation credit is given upon completion of the NSG 197, Traditional to ADN course allowing graduates to enter final year of the program.

Application Procedure

Applicants must meet the following admission criteria prior to March 1 for consideration for the Fall Semester or July 1 for consideration for the Spring Semester. Please check with us for our future admission dates.

- Attend a scheduled Pre-Admission Conference* within the last 2 years
- Complete a Personal Data Form (completed at the Pre-Admission Conference)
- Submit the following to the college admissions office:
 - 1. current application to the college
 - 2. TEAS Test Score (must score at least Proficient)
 - 3. all post-high school transcripts
 - 4. ACT or SAT scores

* Pre-Admission Conferences

Dates for the conferences will be the first Wednesday in September and November and the third Wednesday in January, February, May, and June at 4:00 PM and lasts for one hour. The conference will be held on the Henderson Community College campus. To request additional conference dates call 270-831-9740.

Consideration Process

In addition to the application procedures listed, the process to be considered for the Nursing Program is as follows:

- Complete all applications prior to the deadline.
- Receive and return "Letter of Inquiry."
- Receive notification regarding admission status.
- If accepted, return "Letter of Acceptance/Rejection

Applicants will be notified either in writing and/or via email of admission to the Nursing Program.

Admission

Preference may be given to applicants with the following credentials:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.5 in 12 or more hours of college work
- Composite score of 18 or above on the ACT or equivalent on the SAT
- Compass scores (or ACT) must reflect no need for developmental classes.

Kentucky residents or students residing within the Henderson Community College Service area will be given preference.

Immediate Admission

Immediate consideration to the Associate Degree Nursing program will be considered for qualified applicants. Qualified applicants who have met the necessary requirements outlined in the Henderson Community College AD Nursing brochure and who have a cumulative score of 65 on the HCC AD Nursing Selective Admission Point System may be considered. Copies of the Selective Admission Point System are given to attendees at the Pre-Admission Conference.

All required documents must be current in the HCC Admissions & Records Office before the immediate admission status can be deter mined. Applicants will be notified either in writing or email of admission to the Nursing Program.

Additional Requirements

The following will be required after admission to the program:

- Successful completion of a Medicaid Nurse Aide equivalent course within the past (3) years or proof of active status on the Medicaid Nurse Aide Registry.
- Documentation of digital/computer literacy. This may be through a course of study or challenge exam.
- Indiana and Kentucky Criminal Checks
- Hepatitis and Tetanus Immunizations
- AHA BLS Healthcare Provider CPR Certification
- The following laboratory tests: 2-Step TB Skin Test*, Drug Screen (will be done on campus), Pertussis, Rubella and Rubeola Titer. Proof of immunity to Chickenpox (Varicella) reactive titer, documented history of having had Varicella and the year in which you had it or receive Varivax immunization.

The Varicella Rubella and Rubeola Titer may be waived if documentation can be provided of receipt of the MMR Series.
