Phlebotomy Certificate

This program prepares the student for entry into the field of Phlebotomy.

A phlebotomist generally works in a clinical laboratory under the supervision of a clinical laboratory technologist. The phlebotomist is primarily responsible for collecting blood specimens from patients for the purpose of laboratory analysis.

The certificate can be completed in one semester. Students are taught fundamental techniques for proper venipuncture (drawing blood) and capillary blood specimen collection for lab analysis.

PHB 152 can only be completed by students who are first successful at learning how to draw blood specimens in one of the other classes listed and must be approved by the instructor before taking PHB 152. Students are placed at clinical sites only. Travel may be required for clinical sites and clinical times may vary.

Curriculum choices:

Phlebotomy Certificate - for 1st year MLT students only:

MLT 101 - Introduction to Medical Laboratory

PHB 151 - Phlebotomy for the Healthcare Worker

PHB 152 - Phlebotomy Clinicals

Or

Phlebotomy Certificate - for Medical Assisting students only:

MAI 120 - Medical Assisting Lab Techniques I

PHB 152 - Phlebotomy Clinicals

Or

Phlebotomy Certificate - non-program:

PHB 170 - Applied Phlebotomy

PHB 152 - Phlebotomy Clinicals

Students must receive at least a C in all of the classes to earn the Phlebotomy Certificate. Students must also meet basic college level skills in math, reading and English.

Admission Requirements

- *Submit a completed application to the college.
- *Submit high school or GED transcripts.
- *Submit ACT or equivalent scores.
- *Submit transcripts of all post-secondary education.
- *Schedule an appointment with advisor.

In addition, specific criteria are required for students performing any clinical experience class, including PHB 152. A clinical experience information packet can be obtained in AT 205.

Special requirements include the following:

- Verification of:
 - ⇒ MMR
 - ⇒ Tuberculin skin test
 - ⇒ Up to date tetanus
 - ⇒ Up to date drug screen
 - ⇒ Proof of chicken pox or varicella vaccination or signed waiver of declination.
 - ⇒ Proof of flu vaccination or signed waiver of declination.
 - ⇒ Hepatitis B vaccinations or signed waiver of declination.
- Criminal background check
- Proof of Professional Liability Insurance.
